Renowned designer Thomas Juul-Hansen is leading the complete redesign of interiors at the 17-story building, which was conceived in 1927 as the Hotel Marcy and will now be home to 131 luxury homes. 720 West End Avenue brings a dynamic and fresh residential experience to one of Manhattan's most desirable neighborhoods with an expansive 30,000-square-foot collection of curated indoor/outdoor amenities by Juul-Hansen. Multiple spaces in the impressive collection, including the private dining room, fitness studio and dedicated coworking lounge, are connected to outdoor landscaped terraces and courtyards with lounge seating and dining. This thoughtful layout provides a seamless indoor-outdoor experience for residences and floods the rooms with natural light. The amenity package also includes a private outdoor play garden connected to the children's playroom, perfect for residents of all ages to spend time outdoors.
